VISION STATEMENT AND PURPOSE OF MINISTRY STATEMENT

Purpose-of-Ministry Statement:

We are a responsive, respectful faith community reaching out in service to the needs of those around us with understanding, unlimited compassion and Christ centered support.

Vision Statement:

Our vision of sustainable ministry is to be a center of hospitality, hope and service, responding to the spiritual and basic needs of our community.

What is a doula? A doula is a person who supports people as they birth their babies. I have been serving families as they become parents for 15 years. I own my own business, which primarily serves higher-risk community members. In addition to being a licensed certified birth doula, a certified nursing assistant, an international childbirth educator, a state-trained parenting coach, and a prevention specialist who is traumainformed. I am a bi-vocational person.

The people I care for often have obstacles that create inequities in the birth outcomes; like pregnant teens, people with literally no other support people, people of color, queer couples, and people who will be birthing and then blessing another family with the care of that baby. Their situation is unconventional in some way, and the stress alone of being a-typical can cause considerable complications. Just like society in general, those who don't fit the mold are often reduced to lesser-valued humans and stripped of their dignity, and birth becomes yet another thing that is happening to them instead of happening for them. These are tragic and traumatizing conditions to be so vulnerable in.

Data consistently proves birthing people have better outcomes with the thoughtful support of a birth doula, and I am passionate about giving that gift to those who need it most. Those people are likely to need a particular kind of thoughtful support because while birthing always includes unpredictable variables, we know these people are likely to need a particular emphasis of care.

What is the emphasis of my doula care for these families as they make this intense and sacred transition into parenthood? Love.

Pastoral Love. I know, I know, that sounds corny... I have all these credentials, which I appreciate and value because they have equipped me to reduce my own potential contribution to harm, but really what makes me an exceptional doula is my faith. These worthy humans have often been dehumanized — and the gift of being able to zealously advocate for their well-being, fair and equitable treatment, and offer them compassionate, individualized, and uninterrupted support has the potential to prevent further harm and even create exposure to loving tenderness where there was previously neglect or all out hate.



This is a part of my ministry. As a doula I pray for each person I get to work with, and ask God to transform me into the ambassador of gentle love they are so worthy of. Each client is offered informal pastoral care in the form of processing through their story and how to help heal the birth industry's inequities. I don't charge for my birth and parenting classes. For those in need, I offer rates at 30% to ensure those who need support the most can get it. I also offer bartering and payments. Occasionally, I take a non-trauma client and charge full price to help offset my own expenses. I do all that work with the same heart and guiding Spirit that leads me to preach a sermon. Each birth is one more person being offered redemptive love in the face of a sinful social structure. It is a holy work.

I want to share my doula ministry with you because birth is unpredictable. I will not ever take more than one birth a month while I am your pastor, and even less during certain seasons such as Advent. This helps me balance my 30 hours a week loving on this faith community and the time I spend with developing families. Although it is unlikely, there may come a Sunday morning when I am not in church when I am expected to be because I am having church in the form of welcoming a new soul into the world. I wanted you each to be aware of this possibility. Of course, if that were to ever happen I would contact Pastor Stan or Pastor Pat for assistance. And, I feel confident you all have incredible strength within yourselves, through the many faithful disciples with long histories at Ronald, to manage a shift in the service quite well.

So, in the unlikely event I am ever attending a birth and another minister rises to share the Good News and facilitate our holy communion together, please know I am no less committed to you, and very much fulfilling another facet of my call. May we each find the courage to authentically offer our gifts to the world in this complex and yet remarkable gift of life.


